

## Call for Nominations – 2020 NAPC Commission Excellence Awards

### Submission deadline: March 2, 2020

The National Alliance of Preservation Commissions is now accepting applications for the 2020 NAPC Commission Excellence Awards program to recognize and honor outstanding efforts and achievements by local preservation, historic district, and landmark commissions and boards of architectural review, as well as individual preservationists doing exemplary work at the federal, state and municipal levels.

The NAPC Commission Excellence Awards will be given on a biennial basis and are intended to highlight 'best practices' and exceptional accomplishments by commissions at the local level, for both large and small communities, to protect historic districts and landmarks through legislation, education and advocacy.

Award presentations will be made at FORUM 2020 in Tacoma, WA, July 22-26, 2020. Award recipients will receive one complimentary registration to FORUM, a mounted award certificate, and will be featured in *The Alliance Review*, NAPC's quarterly journal. Honorable mentions, if any, will receive an award certificate and one reduced registration.

#### ■ AWARD CATEGORIES AND CRITERIA

Awards will be given in the two group categories, 'Best Practices' and 'Commission of the Year':

##### (1) Best Practices

'Best Practices' awards may be given in the following areas:

- **Best Practices – Identification/Registration** of historic resources, such as historic resource surveys, historic contexts, local designation reports, and nominations and multiple property submissions for listing on the National Register of Historic Places.
- **Best Practices – Protection** of historic resources, such as preservation ordinances, new program tools/initiatives, rules and regulations, preservation plans and master plans, incentives, design guidelines and policies, grant and revolving fund programs, code enforcement programs, and zoning and building code provisions for historic properties.
- **Best Practices – Public Outreach/Advocacy**, such as brochures, publications, websites, and other outreach materials; markers/signage; workshops, conferences, awards programs and other public participation and education initiatives; and advocacy campaigns and other organized efforts on behalf of local historic preservation or a specific historic resource.
- **Best Practices – Technology**, such as the innovative use of GIS, databases, photography, digitalization and other technology used in the protection and identification of historic resources; and the use of technology for organizing and orchestrating grassroots efforts.

Nominations will be judged on their (a) originality and innovation; (b) transferability as a model for other commissions; (c) comprehensiveness, excellence and degree of difficulty; and (d) impact and results. Judging will consider the size and needs of the local community to ensure that the work of commissions from both small and large communities receives equal consideration.

##### (2) Commission of the Year

The 'Commission of the Year' Award recognizes an outstanding achievement by a local commission under difficult or adverse circumstances. Nominations will be judged on (a) the magnitude and degree of difficulty, (b) comprehensiveness, quality and excellence, and (c) the impact and results of the achievement; and (d) the leadership exemplified by the commission. Consideration will be given in the judging relative to the size and needs of the local community to ensure that commissions from both small and large communities are represented by the awards.

### **(3) Awards will also be given in the following individual categories:**

#### **The John and Sue Renaud Award for Federal/State Leadership to Advance Historic Preservation at the Local Level**

#### **The Daniel L. Becker Professionalism Award for Municipal Leadership**

These "lifetime achievement" awards recognize trailblazers and their long history of professional work in the advancement of historic preservation at the local level. The Renaud award recognizes those working at the federal or state level who have promoted/aided local preservation efforts. The Becker award recognizes those working at the local level. The awards were named to honor the inaugural awardees, who were exemplary in the two specific categories of service.

#### **■ ELIGIBILITY**

Only local preservation, historic district, and landmark commissions and boards of architectural review in the United States and its territories are eligible to receive a Best Practices or Commission of the Year award. Nominations may be self-submitted or submitted without the knowledge of the nominee. Nominators for Best Practices or Commission of the Year awards cannot be current NAPC board members, nor are commissions with NAPC board members as current commission members or staff persons eligible to receive those awards.

Nominations must be submitted digitally by the submission deadline. Nominators must select one award category per submission. A commission may be separately nominated in both the 'Best Practices' and 'Commission of the Year' categories. The nominated effort or achievement must have been completed within the past three years; efforts or achievements not yet completed at the time of submission are ineligible.

#### **■ SUBMISSION INFORMATION**

The submission deadline for the NAPC Commission Excellence Awards is **March 2, 2020**.

Required submission materials are:

- A completed nomination form (see attached).
- A narration (750 words maximum) of how the entry meets the award criteria. Be sure to address the award category and specific judging criteria, as well as the size and needs of the community relative to the commission and these criteria.
- One to three letters of support (current NAPC board members are ineligible to provide letters of support).
- Up to 10 digital, copyright-free images on one USB flash drive (or Dropbox link or email to [director@napcommissions.org](mailto:director@napcommissions.org)) that provide context and/or show the nominated effort. Include photo captions of no more than 25 words for each image.
- As applicable, newspaper or other press clippings or similar materials.

#### **■ JUDGING AND NOTIFICATION**

Jurors are under no obligation to grant an award in any category and may elect to move an entry to a different category. Jurors may also decide to select more than one award winner or honorable mention(s) in any category. There shall be no communication with jurors on behalf of an entry.

Award recipients will be notified approximately 60 days prior to the awards ceremony. All submissions become the property of NAPC and will not be returned. Entries may be reproduced in full, in part or in modified format by NAPC without a fee, charge or copyright infringement.
